# Freedom of Information request: Right to know request

Thank you for your request for information about commercial radio licences.

We initially received this request on 26 May 2024, and it was clarified by you on 7 June 2024. We have considered your clarified request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("the FOI Act").

# Your request

- 1. Number of commercial radio licences in use most recent figures to those in 2019. Iif both (analogue commercial licences, digital commercial licences are possible) it would be greatly appreciated but if cost is an issue I would prefer if DAB was dropped.
- 2. If possible: The number of stations (re-)named under the '(Greatest) Hits' branding most recent figures to those in 2019
- 3. If possible: number of (radio) stations currently owned by Bauer Media Audio UK- most recent figures to those in 2019

#### Our response

Please find the numbers you have requested as of June 2024. Our licensing database is a 'live' system, which means we are unable to look at historical data. As such, the information we have provided reflects the current licensing position and does not compare or reflect the licensing position in 2019 as we do not hold this information.

# Information Requests

#### Request an internal review

If you are unhappy with the response you have received to your request for information, or think that your request was refused without a reason valid under the law, you may ask for an internal review. If you do, it will be subject to an independent review within Ofcom. We will either uphold the original decision, or reverse or modify it.

There is no statutory deadline for us to complete our internal review, and the time it takes will depend on the complexity of the request. But we will try to complete the review within 20 working days (or no more than 40 working days in exceptional cases) and keep you informed of our progress.
