Freedom of Information request: Right to know request

Thank you for your request for information about the impartiality rules that apply to broadcasting channels.

We received this request on 31 October 2024 and we have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Your request

Could you please tell me (Under freedom of information) over the last 5 years how many times has the 1. BBC 2. Sky 3 ITV broken Impartiality laws and how much has each broadcaster been fined.

Our response

This information is obtainable in Ofcom's <u>Broadcast and On Demand Bulletin</u>, available on our website.

Of the broadcasters you list in your request, within the last 5 years the BBC was found to be in breach of the Broadcasting Code rules on due impartiality on one occasion. A copy of our decision can be found <u>here</u>. There have been no breaches of the due impartiality rules recorded against Sky or ITV within the same period.

There have been no sanctions against these broadcasters in that period in relation to breaches of the due impartiality rules.
