As an overall package the changes proposed do not change the overall character of the service.

The nature of radio stations based within any academic organisation does mean that there will be occasions when the nature of output should have a degree of flexibility.

Ofcom should take a holistic view of output, and consider key commitments as a starting position which can be exceeded.

By redefining the audience as young people, rather than students, widens the scope of the service, and presents opportunities for more diverse and inclusive programming. As an overall spread of changes the shift in speech:music ratios are more than compensated by the increased promise of live output.
