

## Your response

With specific reference to OFCOM Proposed Annual Plan 2019/20 section 4.24 – Protecting Customers From Harm – Nuisance Calls, I would like to request that OFCOM require BT, and, where applicable, other network operators, to restrict and / or inhibit and / or bar all incoming international calls which carry false Calling Line Identification (CLI) information which relates to a UK PSTN number.

To put this into context, I currently receive, on average, one nuisance call per day to my BT-provided landline, which is registered with the Telephone Preference Service and also exdirectory. The vast majority of these calls are delivered with CLI information which indicates they are International in origin, but which also includes what appears to be a valid UK PSTN number. I suspect BT have the ability to identify such calls as fake calls, and as such it should be possible to prevent them from being delivered. I also believe that under the terms of the network operator's licence, it is a requirement that operators must not use their networks, or allow them to be used for criminal purposes, which no-doubt most of these fake CLI calls are. This is clearly an increasing problem which I believe OFCOM should be dealing with much more actively, in order to protect customers.
