Question	Your response
Question 1: Do you agree with our proposal to ban GT leasing to third parties? If not, please explain your reasons including how you would prevent malicious signalling by les- sees.	No I do not agree with your proposal to ban GT leasing.
	We are part of the SS7 ecosystem and rely on using leased GTs to perform our service at hlrlookup.com. Un- der your list of use cases you do not specifically list but we may come under "Authentication Services".
	We are a small UK SME. If OFCOM ban GT leasing in the UK then OFCOM would purposely negatively affect my small business as we rely on leasing of GTs to perform our business.
	We assist SMEs in detecting fraudulent signups to their websites by highlighting if a mobile telephone number is real/not real.
	By banning GT leasing, if we are unable to perform our service, this will cause potential harm to UK SMEs.
	We must have SS7 access to perform our HLR lookup, and to receive responses over SS7 we must have a Global Title which routes to our service. There is currently no vi- able alternative as our GT lessor provider does not have the ability to provide the same service via API.
	We provide services for aggregators to detect when tele- phone numbers have ported, which network they have ported to (for least cost routing) and if the destination MSISDN is live/not live allocated/not allocated. This ser- vice is crucial for reducing the cost of sending SMS for A2P providers.
	We also provide a service when a company with existing datasets can check if the mobile telephone numbers they hold are still active. This is a crucial part of GDPR compliance as the customer can detect when an as- signed MSISDN has become unassigned and our cus- tomer can remove or flag the MSISDN in their database as "gone away". If the MSISDN is reassigned to a new user, then our customer knows not to send SMS to the MSISDN any more and can avoid sending personally identifiable information over SMS to a third party.

Question	Your response
	Via resellers of ours, we supply the HLR lookup service to HMRC at Hmrc.gov.uk where every MSISDN that is en- tered into HMRC.gov.uk website is verified to be real and active and assigned to a subscriber.
	Our service has provided the HLR Lookup service to help mitigate fraud to HSBC, Barclays, Tesco plus many more UK companies.
	We applied to OFCOM for a numbering range so that we can have our own GTs so that we do not have to lease them. OFCOM denied our application citing that "Ofcom places particular emphasis on whether an applicant can demonstrate that it will be able to use that MNC/Mobile number in providing Mobile Services in the UK."
	If OFCOM are unwilling to allow us to have our own mo- bile number range because we are not an MNO, then there is no alternative for us to have access to the SS7 network except via leased Global Titles.
	To prevent malicious signalling by lesees the lessor can add into their Letter Of Authority that the Lesee can only use the GTs for a limited use case. For example that the lessee can only use the GT for FS.11 Category 1 packets. This can be implemented by the interconnecting SCCP carrier.
	The lessor could also require routing via the lessor and filter traffic themselves.
	Banning leasing GTs is akin to banning leasing of cars be- cause some people used the car in a robbery.
Question 2: Do you agree with our proposal to only include exemptions to our ban on GT leasing re-lating to intra-group and supplier use? If you consider that any other exemptions are necessary, please explain how these exemptions could be limited to prevent malicious signalling by lessees.	No I don't agree to this. I think that HLR Lookup should have an exemption because we rely on GT leasing to be able to perform our business (see answer 1 above). To prevent malicious signalling by lessees the lessor can stipulate that the GT can only be used for SRIforSM (HLR Lookup) and filter other traffic.
