<p>Question 1: Please provide feedback on the additions, amendments and clarifications we have made to the wording of the licence condition to implement our decisions on the scope of the licence condition in our October 2020 Statement, giving reasons for your response.</p>	<p>Confidential? – Y / N</p> <p>In many places in these documents (e.g. in relation to the 10W exemption A3.2 and to shared sites A3.28), you refer to equipment that is "authorised to operate at powers . . ." The term "authorised to" is a problem for Amateurs, because although we may be installing or using equipment which is incapable of exceeding 10W or 100W, our licences generally authorise up to 400W (and more in EIRP). What is important here is what is installed or used, not what is authorised.</p>

The Guidance states that licensees may rely on the Calculator to demonstrate compliance, yet you do not accept responsibility for its accuracy or fitness for purpose:</p> <p>"A2.16 For calculations, the EMF calculator on Ofcom's website may be used. Licensees, installers and users may print out the results of the calculations using this calculator and use these as records for demonstrating compliance with an EMF-related condition."</p> <p>while the Calculator states that "No representation or warranty is given as to the accuracy, completeness or correctness of the provided Model and it is provided 'as is'. It is provided without any representation or endorsement made and without warranty of any kind, whether express or implied, including but not limited to the implied warranties of satisfactory quality, fitness for a particular purpose, non-infringement, compatibility, security and accuracy."</p> <p>Is it fit for the purpose of demonstrating compliance with your requirements or not?</p>
