Question	Your response
Question 1: What are stakeholder views on how Ofcom should assess and measure BBC performance?	Accessibility – can audiences continue to view and listen on tv and radio, without being forced to move to online before they want. Funds spent in and around UK. Funds targeted at UK audiences.
