Consultation question 1: Do you agree with our proposed administrative priorities framework? Please provide further information and/or evidence in support of your response.	Confidential? – N We agree with the proposed changes.	
Consultation question 2: Do you agree with our proposal to share a summary of the issues raised with the broadcaster rather than the full text of the complaint apart from in exceptional circumstances? Please provide further information and/or evidence in support of your response.	 It is possible there will be a negative impact on decision equity because the relevance of comments will be filtered, and therefore, there is a risk of losing facts or comments that may seem irrelevant at first glance, but are in fact relevant to production individuals, for example. There is no clear purpose for keeping the full details of the complaint from the broadcaster in general. We acknowledge there may be some exceptions where details need to be held back to protect the complainant's confidentiality (but see our response to Question 3). 	
Consultation question 3: Do you agree with our proposal to not share the name of the complainant with the broadcaster, apart from in exceptional circumstances? Please provide further information and/or evidence in support of your response.	Confidential? – N We believe it would be difficult for broadcasters to defend complaints about equity and privacy without obtaining the details of the complainant, as cases are likely to be fact-specific. We have no objection to complainant confidentiality in cases of breaching the broadcasting standards.	
Consultation question 4: Do you agree with our proposal to no longer notify the complainant of the outcome of their complaint? Please provide further information and/or evidence in support of your response.	Confidential? – N We appreciate the need for resources to be provided effectively and carefully.	

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Consultation question 5: Do you agree with our proposal that complaints should be made within 20 working days of the broadcast of the relevant content? Please provide further information and/or evidence in support of your response.	Confidential? – N We agree with this proposal. We suggest a time extension should be allowed, but only as a rare exception, in order to ensure the best evidence is still available, and also to ensure the best use of resources.
