- 3b) This is a difficult issue. The addition of nationality (e.g. Welsh) in the 'white' option but not others is concerning, but in the interests of benchmarking it is sensible that the categories correspond to the ONS ones.

Putting Middle East/Arab Origin options under 'other' is also problematic but I don't necessarily have a different suggestion.
