I am writing this email in regards to the changes requested in Radio Asian Fever's licence.

To my knowledge Radio Asian Fever has been breaching its licence since it was granted the community radio licence, it has yearly been changing its name during the month of Ramadan to Islam Fever and running the station just for the Muslim community (24/7 during Ramadan Month).

The station has always put the religion of Islam above other religions, it has always aired more content for the Muslim community than any other communities during festival periods. The Hinduism, Sikhism and Christianity have had airtime given but not as much as Islam.

I believe a station catering for the South Asian community should be based on same structure all year round, and not change its format to cater for any religion, certainly not a full month.

I request Ofcom to please research on Radio Asian Fever and how it's met its key commitments during its time on air. And if they could look into the committee member who are apart of the station and are they from one religion or do they have members in the committee of other religions.

My last words on this is that the only reason Radio Asian Fever has put in a request to change its key commitments is because Ofcom recently said they had been breaching there licence as they have been broadcasting 24/7 during Ramadan.
