Question 1: Do you agree that Ofcom should cease to apply the policy to not grant the same applicant more than two SRSLs in a single year, or one SRSL if the service is within the M25?	Providing that frequencies are freely available, there is no useful purpose served by this rule. My concern would be that if there are too many SRSLs appearing on multiple occasions in the same year, this could reduce the availability of frequencies with the possible result that other services are unable to get on air. I would see this as a reduction in choice of services .
Question 2: Do you agree that Ofcom should cease to apply the policy to not grant SRSLs where the service proposed to be provided does not appear to be different from what is available on the commercial and community services in the area of broadcast?	Yes, this is anti-competitive and not in the consumer's best interest. Existing or even new radio stations should not be protected from competition.
