## For the sake of the wider Local radio network

My understanding is that we are looking at 49 station that have been acquired becoming part of this new regional radio station.

If you have a *profitable*, *well supported local station with listeners wishing to listen and advertiser's wishing to advertise* then they must be kept.

I quite understand that for business reasons stations that are unprofitable and have poor listener figurers should be looked at in terms of revising format, content and coverage. We do not want a business forced to run an unprofitable station IF there is no local demand or support.

So this decision needs to be based on retaining all popular, profitable and successful stations and looking at those that are not to revise and renew.

OFCOM must continue to support true local radio. It must not succumb to big business pressures who are driven by bottom line profits, shareholders and a PLC board whose main aim is to drive up the share price.

In conclusion; since I found out about these proposals I have spoken to the founding Chair of Spirit FM, an early Director and a former MD. They are all simply horrified that we may lose Spirit and the break-up of the local radio network by an International Media Organisation with no roots in the community.
