<p>Do you agree that for the purposes of where locally-made programming may come from, Ofcom should approve the 'South of England (Bauer)' area in relation to the 12 local licences listed in Section 2 of this document? If you do not agree, please give reasons.</p>	<p>No, I do not agree with the proposal given above by Bauer. First and foremost, they are taking away the whole idea of 'local radio', by having a radio station that only has drive-time for the south east as a whole, and is hosted up in London so has no physical connection to the location where it matters most – locally and within the amazing community that Spirit FM has itself become a part of.</p> <p>Additional to the above, Bauer is wiping away years, decades even, of hard worn trust built into the community, as well as taking away a valuable resource to everyone who listens in daily.
