Confidential? — N I object very strongly to all OfCom's application of Code Powers, regardless of applicant, in the absence of any proper diligence concerning human health or impacts on biodiversity. There is now ample evidence that this technology is harmful to both people and planet. I am also concerned that the uses of this technology are not addressed and that it appears dangerous to civil rights and privacy. Until proper, independent research has been published to clarify safe levels of exposure to RF radiation for people, animals, plants, and pollinating insects, it is unacceptable to seek to override due planning process and the precautionary principle and coerce people into accepting harmful technology, putting private profit and totalitarianism before the public interest. In recklessly applying these powers, OfCom is failing in its statutory duty to the public. If they result in harm to people or the environment, they will protect OfCom or the companies themselves from litigation where harm occurs. Please cease all use of these powers immediately. Major and dangerous developments like these must go through a proper planning and environmental assessment process. Companies seeking them must also demonstrate clearly how their proposals safeguard democracy, human rights, and personal freedoms.
