<p><b>Q1. Do you agree with our proposal to remove the requirement for licence-exempt indoor mobile repeaters to carry a 2G and/or 3G signal? If not, please set out your reasons with any supporting evidence.</b></p>	<p>Yes – we agree with the proposal.</p> <p>Our position above notwithstanding, we do not agree with Ofcom’s characterisation in paragraph 1.3 of the consultation document that repeaters will become ‘illegal’ in the event that the proposed amendments are not made.</p>
	<p>This is because paragraph 9 of the Wireless Telegraphy (Mobile Repeater) (Exemption) Regulations 2022 only requires amplification of signals ‘carried by that mobile network operator’. We do not expect repeaters to be caught by this provision where GSM or UMTS signals are not carried by a mobile operator (e.g. after a 3G network/service has been withdrawn). However, this does not make a material difference to our support for the Ofcom proposal.</p>
<p><b>Q2. Do you agree with our proposals to amend the 2022 Regulations and associated Interface Requirements to align the use of in-vehicle mobile repeaters with the provisions for use of indoor repeaters? If not, please set out your reasons with any supporting evidence.</b></p>	<p>Yes</p>
