Nextivity agrees with Ofcom's reasoning, and we note that this brings IR2102 in-line with similar regulations in, for instance, the Republic of Ireland and the USA that do not place any restrictions on the relaying of a 4G signal and where no instances of the perceived problems with non-VoLTE phones and emergency calling have to our knowledge been reported.
