Question 1: Should Ofcom exercise its discretion to consent to the application to vary the Bradford small-scale multiplex licensed area, with regard to the statutory and policy considerations set out in this document?	Confidential? – N
	Ofcom should not consent to the application to vary the Bradford small-scale multiplex licensed area, given the significant reduction in coverage it would entail. The proposed change would result in a decrease affecting approximately 8,000 adults, with areas like Shipley, Baildon, and Guiseley losing coverage.
	This decrease in coverage is not justified, especially considering the magnitude and location of the coverage losses. Additionally, granting this significant variation disadvantages other competitive applicants who may have been better suited to deliver this multiplex. Consent to the application would not only harm existing coverage but also perpetuate an unjust environment for other potential applicants.
	Moreover, the fact that the applicant for the variation has overpromised and is now failing to deliver the service as originally intended highlights a lack of accountability and performance. Therefore, it is imperative for Ofcom to prioritise fairness and integrity in the licensing process by not consenting to the application. Doing so would uphold the standards of the broadcasting industry and ensure that licence holders are held accountable for their commitments to providing reliable and consistent services to the community. Therefore, Ofcom should not exercise its discretion to consent to the application to vary the Bradford small-scale multiplex licensed area. If the licence holder is unable to deliver the service in the original application then it should surrender the licence for the multiplex and allow a more suited community led consortium to deliver this service.
