Question 1: Should Ofcom exercise its discretion to consent to the applica- tion to vary the Bradford small-scale multiplex licensed area, with regard to the statutory and policy considera- tions set out in this document?	We support Ofcom's view that it should vary the Brad- ford small scale multiplex licensed area. Small Scale DAB operates on a very different economic model to existing local and national DAB infrastructure, and that model is still evolving as multiplex operators gain experience from operating their licences. Reasona- ble flexibility is required to allow operators to adjust their costs to make their licences sustainable. Often ac- cepting shorter lease terms can dramatically improve the ability of the licensee to secure affordable sites. Whilst a change in the technical plan will cause a change to the achieved coverage, the licensee's incentive will be to maximise coverage efficiency alongside sustainability, subject to remaining broadly within the coverage defini- tion of the originally licensed multiplex area. Section 7.10 of the Small-scale radio multiplex licences Guidance notes suggests that any reduction in covered population triggers a full consultation. We would like to raise the question of whether a less onerous process might be feasible if the impact of coverage loss fell be- low a percentage threshold.
