As a member of the LGBT community I am happy for Chorley FM to amend its key commitments. It is impractical for a radio station in a small town like Chorley to target the LGBT community as there are no local venues or media outlets where such a station can be publicised, virtually no LGBT groups of any kind, and volunteers who happen to be lesbian gay bisexual or transgender generally want to be active in the wider community rather than work on a specifically LGBT service. I am sure that the station will continue to be inclusive of LGBT people without it being a named target group - which has in the past been felt by some people to be either ghettoizing or giving unwarranted special treatment to the LGBT community. I think the radio station's original intentions were good, but society's attitudes have moved on and a specially targeted service for LGBT people is no longer relevant in a small town like Chorley.
