

Additional comments:

I have been contacted by Royal Mail today regarding their proposed 'Out and About' policy. I feel delivery of mail and parcels only the the address stipulated is very important, and a system that has been relied on for many years.

It would be fairer for those happy to have their mail/parcel to be left with neighbours to have the stickers and OPT IN to the system.
