

Additional comments:

This proposal is fundamentally flawed. It cannot distinguish between different members of a household who cannot agree on whether to opt-out. This may, in certain circumstances, be discriminatory (e.g. on grounds of disability, where a person at a mutli-occupied address with a single collection point cannot visit the local sorting office). Nor can the system cope with the requirements of senders who may routinely not want items to be delivered to anyone else but the person named at a specific address. I also think that any system which transfers responsibility to a third party is unsatisfactory, for obvious reasons. We have too many problems with private couriers already!
