

Additional comments:

I disagree with this proposed scheme. The Royal Mail are paid to deliver mail to a specific person at the address of that person. Royal Mail personnel are vetted to ensure that they do this safely and confidentially. I trust them. However, I do not want my neighbours to know about my private affairs and I do not want to know about theirs. This proposal is therefore a disgrace. My having to opt 'out' of the scheme and display a sign to that effect rather than opting 'in' is wrong. Royal Mail informing me about their proposal on August 29th, five days after the original consultation deadline and just two days before the month they hope to enact it, is outrageous.
