**Question 1: Are there any reasonable grounds why Ofcom should not grant the request to vary the five Wireless Telegraphy Third Generation Mobile Licences by increasing the permitted maximum in-band EIRP to 68dBm as soon as practicable? If so, please explain your reasoning for this:**

Over 1,000 studies worldwide suggest that the current levels of microwave exposure are having significant effects on health. Several European countries and the European Parliament are, in light of the Bio-initiative Report, looking to lower the levels of signal allowed as a precautionary measure because of their long term concern over the health implications of mobile telephony. Given this uncertainty a precautionary approach seems the only responsible one to take and we strongly believe that Ofcom should follow this line and refuse any applications for further band width.
