Question 1: Are there any reasonable grounds why Ofcom should not grant the request to vary the five Wireless Telegraphy Third Generation Mobile Licences by increasing the permitted maximum in-band EIRP to 68dBm as soon as practicable? If so, please explain your reasoning for this:

OFCOM seems to be trying to pull the wool over the eyes of UK citizens. The increase proposed is on a logarithmic scale and is huge ~ 200%!?

The advised 'Precautionary Approach' is being disregarded by Vodafone and other operators but should not be disregarded by OFCOM

There are increasing number of well conducted peer reviewed studies which show direct correlations of microwaves with disease in humans. These are clear reasons for the request not to be granted.

Question 2: Are there any reasonable grounds why Ofcom should not also apply the increased permitted maximum in-band EIRP to future 2 GHz MSS/CGC licences? If so, please explain your reasoning for this:

The route to be encouraged is use of fibreoptics etc- NOT increased microwave load on UK citizens.

Increased building penetration results in people being increasingly affected by microwaves in their homes and this will have undoubted health effects. OFCOM should be aware that Siemens are developing safer indoor reception technology and this should be adopted in due course.

There is no shortfall in the current levels of EIRP permitted - no citizens are clamouring for increased EIRP - therefore there is no reason for changing licenses.

Simply corporate need/greed is not enough reason to adversely affect health of the populace.
