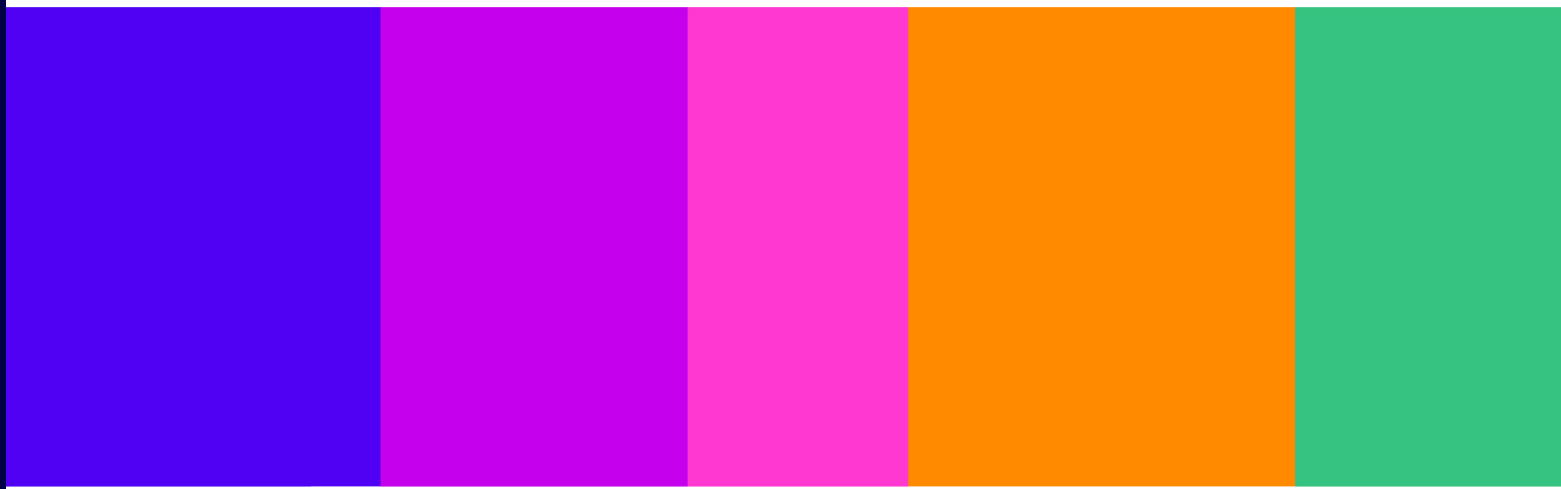


# Survey: Understanding misinformation: an exploration of UK adults' behaviour and attitudes 2024

# Introduction

## Summary of approach

---

YouGov is a professional research and consulting organisation, focused on collecting high quality, in-depth data for market research and has extensive experience of youth, the television and radio broadcasting sectors as well as on-demand services policy research.

This research was conducted with a sample of respondents that is politically representative of the UK population aged 16 and above, taking into account recalled vote and a measure of political attention to include a range of perspectives, including those who did not vote or were too young. All research was carried out online, with respondents recruited from YouGov's online panel.

A total of 4,269 interviews were conducted in this study. Fieldwork was conducted between 27th June - 2nd July 2024

## Significance testing and data redaction

---

Significance testing has been applied at 95% for the purposes of analysis, meaning that there is only a 5% possibility that the difference occurred by chance rather than by being a real difference. This is a commonly accepted level of confidence.

All base sizes below 10 have been redacted/removed from the data tables completely. Base sizes between 10-49 are marked with an \* to indicate a low base.

# Sampling

## Sample design

---

The sample is designed to be nationally representative of the UK population aged 16 and above in terms of political alignment.

A sample frame was constructed using the demographic information available from the YouGov online panel, which consists of over 3.3 million adults in the UK. This frame includes individuals aged 16 and above, as well as relevant demographic and political attributes to ensure representativeness.

A total sample of 4,269 respondents was interviewed. This sample size was determined to provide a high level of statistical confidence and reliability for the survey results.

Selected individuals were invited to participate in the survey via email. Participants consented to complete the survey, understanding that their responses would be used for research purposes.

The survey was administered online, utilising YouGov's survey platform. Participants were provided with a modest financial incentive upon completion.

## Quotas

---

Interview quotas were applied so that the final sample was politically representative of the UK by age/gender/education level, social grade, region/2019 General Election vote, and EU referendum vote.

## Boost

---

To ensure adequate representation of ethnic minority groups, sample boosts were applied to achieve a minimum of 50 interviews among each of the following groups, resulting in a total of 200 additional interviews:

**Black Ethnic Groups:** African, Caribbean, Any other Black/African/Caribbean background

**Asian Ethnic Groups:** Indian, Pakistani, Bangladeshi, Chinese, Any other Asian background

**Mixed Ethnic Groups:** White and Black Caribbean, White and Black African, White and Asian, Any other Mixed/Multiple ethnic background

**Other Ethnic Backgrounds:** Arab, Any other ethnic group

## Weighting:

The data, excluding the boosted samples, has been weighted to be representative of the UK politically representative population by age/gender/education level, social grade, region/ 2019 General Election vote, and EU referendum vote.
